

THE RESEARCH INTO LOST KNOWLEDGE ORGANISATION TRUST

TITLE

The name of the society shall be The Research Into Lost Knowledge Organisation Trust (hereinafter called "the Charity")

OBJECTS OF THE CHARITY

The objects for which the Charity is established are to promote the education and research in England of the arts , sciences and technologies and in particular by promoting public interest in such of the arts , sciences and technologies of the past which have fallen into disuse and are in danger of being forgotten in cases where the recovery and preservation of the knowledge of such arts , sciences and technologies of the past offer present opportunities for public benefit and in furtherance of the above but not otherwise

(1) recovering, collating, recording, cataloguing or by such other means as may be to the public good preserving knowledge of such arts , sciences or technologies for reference purposes in the future and from the studies of such related patterns of historical practice and knowledge seeking more total understanding of the whole of the collective knowledge

(2) undertaking, evaluating, restoring , preserving, maintaining and repairing areas, features, monuments or buildings which by their geometry, geography, architecture , archaeology or relative arrangement contain knowledge or serve as potential lessons from our forebears, particularly from times for which formal records are less complete

(3) promoting interest by the general public and by individuals and students of all descriptions in the benefits of cross - fertilisation of their knowledge, often on subjects of minority attention within their disciplines

(4) acting as a forum for communication between interested amateur individuals in various disciplines to acknowledge their ideas and bring them to the attention of the appropriate professionals for the efficient development of those ideas

(5) acquiring properties connected with the furtherance of the objectives in sub-clause (2) hereof and holding the same upon trust for the Charity

(6) acquiring other properties for the furtherance of the general objects of the Charity

(7) purchasing, maintaining and preserving books, periodicals , manuscripts, works of art , historical records and other objects associated or connected with the history of the knowledge declared in the general objects of the Charity

(8) adopting such means of making known the Charity and its objects as may seem expedient to the members from time to time and in particular by publication of books and periodicals by establishing exhibitions- and lectures by pictures and public exhibitions of works of art , science and technology by conducting competitions and by granting prizes and awards by cinematographs and other mechanical means by radio, television and by use of the press

(9) undertaking, encouraging, sponsoring and/or commissioning such programmes and projects of research as will recover, reveal or advance those areas of useful knowledge which are less well known today than they have been to our forebears

(10) providing and raising funds to promote the objects of the Charity

(11) engaging in all activities which promote and support the objects of the Charity.
